- "My strategy to modify the behavior is to take the phone away and text the person the student was texting once they know this is how I deal with the behavior they avoid texting in class" Deanna Humphry 15 year veteran 8th grade History

Strategies to Modify the Behavior

- Be a good role model for students and try not to use your cell phone in class
- Implement a classroom technology use policy- Research shows that 54% of students agree with this
 idea
- Use technology as a tool during classroom lecture
- Make sure students know that it is disrespectful to look away from someone when they are speaking to you
- Let students know that texting in class is distracting to other students and that if they are texting they are less likely to recall useful information from lecture
